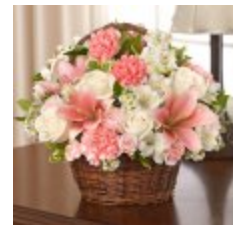

“Cindy was my sister. My parents (Cindy's dad and stepmom) and I visited her on Mar. 17 (St. Patrick's Day) at Sacred Heart Hospital. My dad had asked me to pray for her when we went and I surely felt the weight of that. I knew we were all concerned about Cindy's wellbeing, but most importantly, her soul. We wanted to know she was right with the Lord should He decide to take her at any time. The day before, I prayed for God to give us this day with Cindy. Make her alert, aware, help her to be herself, and be receptive, and responsive. Let us leave knowing where she stands with God. Do not let us leave with question marks in our minds, but make her standing be very clear. Please, God, let her somehow be able to show us. I prayed specifically for God to go before us and "prepare the day", remove any hindrances, and "give us this tie and day with Cindy". Make everything as it should be. There was such a heaviness I felt for Cindy. I just could not shake it, so I prayed so much the day before, in preparation for this day. As we walked towards the hospital, I felt God was saying to me, "Don't get distracted or lose your focus. Remember the importance of this day. This is missional." When Dad and I went in to see her, she was all of those things I had felt impressed to pray for. She was so alert and aware. She seemed more like the Cindy we knew and loved. She held our hands and didn't want us to leave. I told her that her family loved her and we needed to know where she stood with the Lord. I asked if she wanted Jesus in her heart and she showed me she did. Dad was standing off a bit and I told him, "Cindy has indicated that she wants Jesus. Let's join hands and pray." Dad and I prayed the sinner's prayer with her. We wanted to be sure. She pointed up, as if pointing to Jesus and then patted her chest and nodded "yes", signifying that Jesus was in her heart. Praise God! My mom came in afterwards and she also talked to Cindy and verified this. Cindy continued to point upwards, pat her chest and nod "yes". We left that day feeling such great relief. For me personally, I walked out of the hospital feeling very much awe-struck... at what an awesome God we have, for God had surely given me every single thing I had asked for and had truly given us this day with Cindy... a divine appointment. It was the last time I saw my sister alive. I thank God
